How the 113th Congress Voted

This Bread for the World voting scorecard shows how senators and representatives voted on legislation that would impact hungry and poor people in the United States and around the world. Specifically, this report tracks votes in the 113th Congress—from January 2013 to July 2014, when this report was produced.

During the 113th Congress, Bread has been following votes on a range of issues: funding for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly food stamps) and poverty-focused development assistance; budget votes to reopen the government and partially replace sequestration; and House and Senate amendments that support food-aid reform.

During the 2014 congressional campaign season, this scorecard can be a helpful resource as you listen to candidates debate the issues that are important to you. You can use its information to thank members of

Congress for votes that supported our efforts to make ending hunger a national priority and to voice concern about votes that will result in increased hunger.

Descriptions of Senate Votes

Farm Bill

1. **The Inhofe Amendment (#960) to the Senate Farm Bill** (the Agriculture Reform, Food, and Jobs Act of 2013, S.954) would have turned SNAP into a block grant program. *Bread for the World opposed the amendment. It failed 36-60.*

2. **The Roberts Amendment (#948) to the Senate Farm Bill (S. 954)** would have further cut SNAP in the farm bill. If enacted, these cuts would have kicked 2 million people off the program, reduced monthly benefits for approximately 800,000 households, and led to more than 200,000 children losing access to free school meals. Additionally, it would have cut key employment, training, and nutrition education programs. *Bread for the World opposed the amendment. It failed 40-58.*

- 3. The Gillibrand Amendment (#931) to the Senate Farm Bill (S. 954)** would have restored \$4.1 billion in funding to SNAP that was cut in the Senate farm bill. If enacted, these cuts would have meant more than 400,000 families losing approximately \$90 a month in SNAP benefits. *Bread for the World supported the amendment. It failed 26-70.*

Poverty-Focused Development Assistance (PFDA)

- 4. The Paul Amendment (#382) to the Murray Budget (S. Con. Res. 8)** proposed cutting the fiscal year 2014 International Affairs Budget by 33 percent. *Bread for the World opposed this amendment. It failed 26-72.*

Budget

- 5. The Senate Fiscal Year 2014 Budget (S. Con. Res. 8)** would replace sequestration with a mix of spending cuts and revenue increases. The budget dedicates an entire section to protecting vulnerable families. It emphasizes programs for hungry and poor people, particularly SNAP; the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC); the earned income tax credit (EITC); and the child tax credit (CTC). It would also increase the international affairs account as well as make permanent the 2009 improvements to the EITC and CTC. *Bread for the World supported this resolution. It passed 50-49.*
- 6. Continuing Resolution to Re-open the Government (H.R. 2775)** re-opened the government after a 16-day shutdown. This clean continuing resolution (CR) was a short-term extension to give Congress time to agree upon a budget for the remainder of the fiscal year. The bill also raised the debt ceiling to prevent the United States from defaulting on its obligations. *Bread for the World supported this bill. It passed 81-18.*
- 7. Bipartisan Budget Deal (H.J.Res. 59)**, also known as the Bipartisan Budget Act, established a budget framework and replaced most of the 2014 sequester and some of the 2015 sequester. While not perfect, the bill was a first step in addressing the harmful sequestration cuts to programs like WIC and

poverty-focused development assistance. It also provides budget stability and economic certainty. *Bread for the World supported this bill. It passed 64-36.*

- 8. Fiscal Year 2014 Omnibus Appropriations (H.R. 3547)** provides discretionary spending at \$1.012 trillion, the level agreed to in the Ryan-Murray Bipartisan Budget Act of 2013, which replaced the sequester for fiscal years 2014 and 2015. The bill restores some of the cuts made by sequestration and other cuts of recent years. Many of the international and domestic anti-hunger and anti-poverty programs Bread cares about were well-funded. *Bread for the World supported this bill. It passed 72-26.*

Minimum Wage/Unemployment Benefits

- 9. Minimum Wage Fairness Act (S. 2223)** would have raised the minimum wage to \$10.10 and indexed it for inflation. It would have raised the minimum wage for tipped workers to 70 percent of the minimum wage. Income from work is the primary buffer against hunger for the vast majority of American families, yet increasing numbers of jobs pay poverty-level wages. An increase in the minimum wage could significantly alleviate hunger. The bill needed 60 votes to proceed in the Senate. *Bread for the World supported this bill. It failed 54-42.*
- 10. Emergency Unemployment Compensation Extension Act of 2014 (H.R. 3979):** Federal emergency unemployment benefits expired Dec. 28, 2013, when millions of workers began to be cut off this assistance. H.R. 3979 originally passed the House as the “Protecting Volunteer Firefighters and Emergency Responders Act of 2014.” However, the Senate amended it and passed it as the “Emergency Unemployment Compensation Extension Act of 2014.” The amended version would have extended benefits for an additional 6 months for those who were seeking but were unable to find work. Emergency unemployment insurance enables jobless workers to continue searching for work and put food on the table. *Bread for the World supported this bill. The amended bill passed the Senate 59-38, but it stalled in the House.*

Descriptions of House of Representatives Votes

Farm Bill Amendments

1. **The McGovern Amendment to the House Farm Bill (Federal Agriculture Reform and Risk Management Act, H.R. 1947)** would have restored the \$20.5 billion in SNAP cuts included in the House bill by cutting commodity programs and crop insurance payments. *Bread for the World supported this amendment. It failed 188-234.*
2. **The Royce-Engel Amendment to the House Farm Bill (H.R. 1947)** included common sense food-aid reforms, providing much-needed flexibility in the Food for Peace program. It would have helped the United States reach an additional 4 million disaster survivors through overseas food assistance without spending any additional taxpayer dollars. *Bread for the World supported this amendment. It failed 203-220.*
3. **The Huelskamp Amendment to the House Farm Bill (H.R. 1947)** would have cut SNAP funding by \$31 billion and eliminated programs such as SNAP nutrition education and job training, which help participants transition out of poverty. Although the SNAP program has existing work requirements, this amendment would have imposed additional requirements, making it more difficult for qualifying participants to access the safety-net program when they need it. *Bread for the World opposed this amendment. It failed 175-250.*
4. **The Southerland Amendment to the House Farm Bill (H.R. 1947)** created an option that would allow states to change their SNAP work requirements to match stricter federal welfare work requirements and financially incentivize states to reduce SNAP caseloads by providing funding to states based on how much they reduce caseloads. *Bread for the World opposed this amendment. It passed 227-198.*

Farm Bill

5. **The House Farm Bill (The Federal Agriculture Reform and Risk Management Act of 2013, H.R. 1947)** would have extended SNAP and international food-aid programs through fiscal year 2018 but cut SNAP by over \$20 billion and food aid by over \$2.5 billion. *Bread for the World opposed this bill. It failed 195-234.*
6. **The House “Farm-Only” Farm Bill (The Federal Agriculture Reform and Risk Management Act of 2013, H.R. 2642)** would extend farm programs and international food-aid programs through fiscal year 2018, but did not

include SNAP. It also cut food aid by over \$2.5 billion. *Bread for the World opposed this bill. It passed 216-208.*

7. **The House “Nutrition-Only” Farm Bill (The Nutrition Reform and Work Opportunity Act of 2013, H.R. 3102)** extended SNAP but included nearly \$40 billion in cuts to the program as well as harmful policy changes identical to those included in the Southerland Amendment to the original House farm bill. *Bread for the World opposed this bill. It passed 217-210.*

Budget

8. **The House Fiscal Year 2014 Budget (H. Con. Res. 25)** would cut nondefense spending by \$5 trillion over 10 years. Two-thirds of those cuts would have hit anti-poverty programs, causing devastating impacts on programs like the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), SNAP, the earned income tax credit (EITC), and the child tax credit (CTC). Internationally, it would have made international food aid and poverty-focused foreign assistance vulnerable to cuts that would undermine our national security. *Bread for the World opposed this budget. It passed 221-207.*
9. **Continuing Resolution to Re-open the Government (H.R. 2775)** re-opened the government after a 16-day shutdown. This clean continuing resolution (CR) was a short-term extension to give Congress time to agree upon a budget for the remainder of the fiscal year. The bill also raised the debt ceiling to prevent the United States from defaulting on its obligations. *Bread for the World supported this bill. It passed 285-144.*
10. **Bipartisan Budget Deal (H.J.Res. 59)**, also known as the Bipartisan Budget Act, established a budget framework and replaced most of the 2014 sequester and some of the 2015 sequester. While not perfect, the bill was a first step in addressing the harmful sequestration cuts to programs like WIC and poverty-focused development assistance. It also provided budget stability and economic certainty. *Bread for the World supported this bill. It passed 332-94.*
11. **Fiscal Year 2014 Omnibus Appropriations (H.R. 3547)** provided discretionary spending at \$1.012 trillion, the level agreed to in the Ryan-Murray Bipartisan Budget Act of 2013, which replaced the sequester for fiscal years 2014 and 2015. The bill restored some of the cuts made by sequestration and other cuts of recent years. Many of the international and domestic anti-hunger and anti-poverty programs Bread cares about were well-funded. *Bread for the World supported this bill. It passed 359-67.*

A score of 100% means that the member of Congress voted with all of Bread for the World's positions. A vote of 0% means that the member voted with none of Bread for the World's positions.

12. The House Fiscal Year 2015 Budget (H. Con. Res. 96) contained devastating cuts that would severely undermine the country's ability to address hunger and poverty: 69 percent of the budget's \$4.8 trillion non-defense cuts are to low-income programs. The budget also cuts SNAP by \$137 billion, converting it to a block grant program and making eligibility changes, which would kick nearly 4 million people off the program. The House budget also cut the International Affairs budget by a devastating 11 percent, diminishing that total budget by 24 percent compared to 2010. *Bread for the World opposed this bill. It passed 219-205.*

Food-Aid Reform

13. The Royce Amendment (#7) to the Fiscal Year 2015 Agriculture Appropriations Bill (H.R. 4800) provides \$10 million for the USDA Local and Regional Procurement (LRP) Program, which was permanently authorized in the Agricultural Act of 2014, and provides a means for more flexible and cost-effective food-aid programs. Funding for LRP will help improve the sustainability of school-feeding programs and can help establish local supply chains and markets to provide food for development programs. *Bread for the World supported this amendment. It passed 223-198.*

You Make A Difference: Victories from Recent Offerings of Letters

2007 This Offering sought to win broad reform in the U.S. farm bill—making commodity programs into a more equitable safety net for our nation’s farmers, and shifting additional resources into nutrition, conservation, and rural development programs. Though commodity payment programs were not substantially reformed, the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 did include the largest-ever funding increase for food stamps and food banks—an additional \$10 billion over 10 years.

2008 Bread for the World pushed for more and better international development assistance. Our efforts helped win a supplemental appropriation of \$1.8 billion to respond to the global hunger crisis. Our efforts to garner cosponsors for the Global Poverty Act helped build the political will that helped initiate foreign assistance reform efforts in 2009.

2009 Bread for the World members urged Congress and the administration to reform the way we deliver foreign aid to make it more effective in fighting poverty. As a result of our efforts, bipartisan bills were introduced in the House and Senate to begin the process of reforming the Foreign Assistance Act. In addition, President Barack Obama and the State Department ordered reviews to better coordinate how the United States delivers foreign assistance. Congress also increased funding for programs that fight hunger and poverty worldwide.

2010 December was a historic month for Bread for the World, as Congress passed two bills for which we had been advocating. The Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act—a five-year renewal of child nutrition programs—authorized an increase of \$4.5 billion over 10 years, the largest increase of its kind. The Tax Relief, Unemployment Insurance Reauthorization, and Job Creation Act of 2010—a compromise tax package—included key tax credits for low-income working families. The law continued the Earned Income Tax Credit and the Child Tax Credit improvements that were about to expire,

which was the goal of this Offering. Congress extended the benefits for another two years, which lifts millions of low-income working families out of poverty.

2011 Because of an unprecedented pressure to cut programs vital to hungry and poor people, Bread had to refocus the 2011 Offering of Letters. While we continued to press forward with reforms to make U.S. foreign assistance more effective in reducing poverty, we also worked to create a circle of protection around programs that are critical to hungry and poor people. We prevented disproportionate cuts to these programs in the fiscal year 2011 budget. We also successfully advocated for important reforms to U.S. foreign assistance. Working with both Republican and Democratic members of Congress, Bread assisted in a House of Representatives bill that would promote better accountability, transparency, and efficiency in U.S. foreign assistance.

2012 In the face of continued unprecedented budget threats, Bread for the World called on Congress to maintain a circle of protection around funding for programs vital to hungry and poor people. The House passed proposals that would have cut the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly food stamps) by nearly \$170 billion over the next decade. Yet, after two years of budget fights and over \$2 trillion of enacted deficit reduction, Congress made no major cuts to programs for hungry and poor people. Congress also extended for five years the current Earned Income Tax Credit and Child Tax Credit Benefits—assisting millions of low-income working families. In the final days of the 112th Congress, the House unanimously passed the Foreign Aid Transparency and Accountability Act, a bipartisan bill to improve efficiency among U.S. foreign aid programs. Unfortunately, the bill was held up in the Senate because of one senator who opposed it. We are optimistic that a similar bill will pass both the House and the Senate in the 113th Congress.

2013 In a hostile budget climate and with continued threats of deep cuts to anti-hunger and anti-poverty programs, our 2013 Offering of Letters targeted both Congress and the White House for the first time. We urged Congress to protect critical programs and petitioned the president to set a goal to end hunger. As a result of our work in 2012, the president’s 2013 State of the Union address called for an end to extreme poverty in the United States and around the world. We continued to message the president and received more than 40,000 signatures on our petition to President Obama, which we hand-delivered to the White House in August. During October’s government shutdown and near default on the debt ceiling, we worked with our faith partners to re-open the government and prevent service disruptions that would have disproportionately affected struggling families. Thanks to the efforts of Bread for the World and our partners over the last few years, some of our work came to fruition in 2013. The U.S. Senate Foreign Relations Committee unanimously passed the Foreign Aid Transparency and Accountability Act, which calls for increased and improved monitoring of U.S. foreign assistance and its impact. We are optimistic that the full Senate will take up this bill and pass it in 2014. In a small victory, a budget deal at the close of 2013 suspended the sequester for two years, preventing some cuts to programs that help poor and hungry people.
